TIP OF THE WEEK

LUNCH BOX HACK - HOME MADE MUESLI BARS

Eliminate the waste from plastic and foil wrappers by making your own muesli bars:

- 3/4 c maple syrup, honey or golden syrup
 - 1/2 c peanut butter
 - 3 c wholegrain/rolled oats
 - 1 c mixed seeds/nuts/dried fruit of your choice
- Gently heat the sweetener & peanut butter in a pan and mix well. Add oats and mixed seeds until well combined. Line dish with baking paper and add the mixture. Compact down and cool on bench prior to refrigerating for 1-2 hours to set. Remove and cut into bars. Store in airtight container in fridge.
