
This week we welcomed the following new entrants into Rooms 1 & 3:

## END OF YEAR ENROLMENTS

Please contact the school office if you have not yet advised of pending enrolments between now and the end of the year. Please also check with friends or neighbours who may have students intending to start with us, to ensure they have also enrolled their child.

## WINTER UNIFORM REMINDER

Students are expected to wear full school uniform each day. In the winter months students are permitted to wear black long-sleeved thermals under their school shirt for extra warmth. Students must wear the correct school polar fleece and shorts or culottes. No other sweatshirts or jumpers are permissible. Footwear consists of plain black shoes and socks.

We understand that children may have grown over lockdown and require new uniform or shoes. We have therefore been understanding of non-uniform items over the last week or so. **However from Tuesday 2 June we expect to see all children in the correct uniform, including plain black shoes and socks.**

There are a number of good quality second-hand polar fleeces (size 4 and 6 only) available from school for \$10 each.

All other items of school uniform need to be purchased online from Argyle ([www.argyleonline.co.nz](http://www.argyleonline.co.nz) or use the 'Links' option from the school app to go to their website). Please order early as couriers are under pressure at present and delivery times may take a little longer.

## CHILDREN'S COMMUNITY DENTAL CLINIC

Under Alert Level 2, the Children's Community Dental Clinic are not able to offer routine appointments just yet. Some dental clinics will be open to offer appointments to children with urgent dental care needs. If a child is in pain, or you have immediate concern about a child's teeth, phone 0800 TALK TEETH to speak to a therapist. Please do not go to any of the clinics unless you have an appointment booked.

## PLAY BASED LEARNING

This term, we are introducing an exciting addition to our Year 1 timetable, Play Based Learning. This will happen most days, usually in the first block. The children will be given a variety of learning opportunities that span the curriculum. The learning will be led by the students' interests and they will be able to choose which learning opportunity they would like to participate in and move between them during the session. The teachers will be drawing on their observational skills and curriculum knowledge to identify and guide the learning occurring for students during Play Based Learning.

*"Play focuses on means, not ends: it is process-oriented, and there are many cognitive, behavioural, social, and emotional gains from experiencing play." The Education Hub*

Play Based Learning is an approach that can support students to realise the vision of The NZ Curriculum, which is to develop, "Young people who will be confident, connected, actively involved, lifelong learners." Learning through play brings numerous benefits to students. It can support the development of many skills and dispositions such as, perseverance, collaboration, agency, independence, communication and oral language, problem solving, fine and gross motor skills, creativity and resilience to name just a few. Play Based Learning can also help to smooth the transition to primary school and support students to settle quickly.

We are excited about this addition to our programme, as are our Year 1 students.
